

What affects consent?

Any kind of sexual contact needs to be consensual. These things can affect someone's ability to consent.



Age

In the UK, the legal age of consent for any sexual contact is 16, which means nobody under this age can legally agree to sex.



Alcohol/drugs

Someone can't legally consent to sex if they've had alcohol or drugs. This is because these affect someone's ability to make decisions.



Pressure

Consent to sex needs to be given without feeling pressured or threatened. If a "yes" is given under pressure, it's not consent.



Understanding

Someone needs to understand what they're agreeing to, including the type of sex and what could happen if they do have sex.

TEACH US CONSENT 6. If your friend is making someone else uncomfortable, tell them to stop.

It doesn't have to be confrontational a simple and knowing, "dude what are you doing," should do the trick. Then, consider moving to a different venue.



How to be a greeter not a gatekeeper A STUDEN



- Welcome people into your world and get feedback
- Organising events to make all students feel welcome regardless of race, gender, sexuality, disability whether disclosed or not
- Increasing membership outside of traditional recruitment and timeframes
- Revolving roles in the group: creating inclusive, engaging, participant-led learning activities.
- Identify barriers and obstacles that may prevent members from joining try to reduce at least one of them
- Have a designated EDI Champion
- If for whatever reason you can't increase diversity in the membership group collaborate with other clubs and societies – invite them to events and showcases – for example sports clubs and art society perhaps one year they can design kits etc –
- Consider the effect of non-drinking events and how it creates a more inclusive environment for others.

Exeter University expels students over racism row

University launched investigation after allegations of racism, sexism and homophobia

Several students at the University of Exeter have been expelled following allegations of racism, sexism and homophobia, amid growing anger over discrimination on higher education campuses.

The students were sanctioned over a series of comments made on a WhatsApp group, including racial epithets and messages such as: "If you ain't English, go home," "bomb the mosques" and "we need a race war", according to screengrabs posted online by a fellow student, Arsalan Motavali.

Photos reveal a group from a student society with slogans mocking murder and sexual assault





Students involved in racist BLS group chat now suspended pending 'major investigation'

People are calling for them to be expelled but the decision is yet to be announced



Members of the racist 'Dodgy Blokes Soc' group chat have been suspended while the university and Student Guild continue major investigation into the allegations.

The students have been removed from the Bracton Law Society, the police have been informed, and one member has even had his grad scheme offer revoked.

The Tab Exeter is working non-stop to investigate the outcome of this incident and updates will continue. We have since exclusively named and pictured all five members.

The University of Derby has suspended six male students, including two special constables, over "degrading and offensive" comments allegedly made about their female peers in an online group chat


